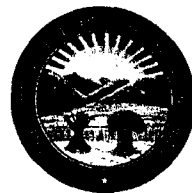

PRESS RELEASE

September 5, 2006

The Georgetown Police Department and the Brown County Coroner's Office are currently investigating an apparent drowning, which occurred at the Georgetown Waste Water Treatment Plant. The plant is located in Georgetown on Influent Drive. A sewer plant worker, Robert J. Creamer, was working at the plant on September 4, 2006. Based upon his work log entry's Mr. Creamer was in the process of taking liquid samples from a large open concrete tank, known as a Clarifier. At this time it appears that for some unknown reason Mr. Creamer fell into the tank and drowned. Based upon his log entries it is believed this happened at approximately 6:00 AM on the 4th.

Based upon evidence located at the plant, it was determined that the probable location of Mr. Creamer would be in Clarifier #1. A large pump was lowered into the tank and approximately four hours later most of the water was pumped from the tank. Rescue personnel were able to locate Mr. Creamer and extract his body from the tank.

Mr. Creamer was an approximate two year employee of the Village of Georgetown and was highly regarded by his co-workers. He was twenty-five years of age and lived in the Russellville area.

The incident is being investigated by the Georgetown Police Department and the Brown County Coroner's Office. Chief Coburn would like to express his appreciation to Deputy Dave Johnson of the Brown County Sheriff's Department for his assistance in the initial search, the Georgetown and Mt. Orab Fire Departments for their extreme effort in the recovery of the body and Village employee's Stewart Patrick and Tom Hurley for all of their assistance during the long hours required in the search. Brown County Coroner Dr. Timothy McKinley will rule on the cause of death after the conclusion of the Autopsy being preformed by the Montgomery County Morgue.
