A series of Break-ins in Georgetown have been solved by the Georgetown Police Department. Beginning in July and August of this year there was a rash of break-ins into homes, businesses and vehicles around Georgetown. The police department took approximately fifteen reports of thefts that all seemed to have similar characteristics. The officers charted where and when the thefts seemed mostly to be happening and adjusted their patrol times accordingly. During the course of the investigations several suspects were identified and targeted by the officers. When enough evidence and information was garnered to reasonably prove some of the suspect's involvement, the officers started picking up some of the suspects for questioning. Chief Buddy Coburn, Patrolmen Bobby Gifford and Todd Waits interviewed four of the suspects and were able to gather enough information to successfully close out nearly all of the open theft cases involved. To date seven adult males have been arrested and charged with over thirty counts of various Felony's ranging up to Felony-2 charges. Chief Buddy Coburn stated, we are not releasing the names of the individuals we have charged yet, because we believe we can make even more cases and charge even more people. All of our officers worked hard on these cases. We have recovered several items thus far and hope to find even more as we continue. My officers take it very personally when something like this happens. They all have a very deep commitment to serving and protecting our citizens. We all put in several long days and nights working on these cases, but the end results have made that all worthwhile.
